
CENTRAL COAST California

Monterey County (includes Monterey, Big Sur, Carmel, Pebble Beach, Pacific Grove, Seaside, Marina, Castroville, Moss Landing, Carmel Valley, Salinas)

San Luis Obispo REGION

Santa Barbara REGION

Santa Barbara County (includes Guadalupe, Santa Maria, Lompoc, Santa Ynez Valley, Santa Ynez, Buellton, Los Olivos, Ballard, Solvang, Goleta, Santa Barbara, Montecito, Summerland, Carpinteria)

SEASONALITY

Central Coast California is a year-round destination, offering a relatively warm climate Labor Day through Memorial Day, or fall through spring.
